Hidden Gems That Can't Be Missed

- ◆ Raystown Lake Region
 - Motorized
 - Rarely freezing, it provides year round boating with no horsepower restrictions and attractions including hiking trails, picnic areas, campgrounds and beaches.
 - With more than 900 slips, Seven Points Marina at Raystown Lake is the largest marina in Pennsylvania.
- ◆ Johnstown Region
 - Paddle Power
 - Stonycreek River Canyon
 - Provides class III-IV rapids, this great small river is perfect for whitewater paddlers.

 - Sailing
 - Bald Eagle State Park
